



NOVICE – Class 2

The judge will call, “Novice, exhibit {number}.”

Handler will enter the ring and take their position to the left of the cone.

The judge will ask, “Are you ready?”

Handler will check their dog is in the *ready* position and indicate with a verbal, “Yes”

The judge will say, “forward.”

The handler will be asked to perform the following heeling exercises up to 3 times each:

Sit – stand – drop – right turn – left turn – right about turn – left about turn

The handler has a maximum of 5 seconds to perform each task before the judge continues the session.

When the judge says, “exercise finished” the handler must return to the starting position at the cone.

The handler will be asked to perform the following stationary tasks:

Recall

The judge will say, “forward and halt.”

The handler will take 3 steps forward and sit their dog.

The judge will say, “for a recall, leave your dog”

The handler will command their dog to wait, take 3 steps forward (to the end of the lead), turn and face their dog.

The judge will say, “Call your dog”

The handler will take a few steps backwards calling their dog.

The judge will say “return to your dog”

The handler will step back to their dog (NOT around their dog)

Stand stay

The judge will say, “forward and stand your dog.”

The handler will take 3 steps forward to put their dog in a stand.

The judge will say, “leave your dog”

The handler will command their dog to stay and step in front of their dog.

The judge will approach and around the dog and handler.

The judge will say, “exercise finished, you may leave the ring.”

The handler walks their dog out of the ring before releasing/praising their dog.

Sit stay

Once all exhibits from Class 1 and Class 2 have been assessed, the judge will call, “All novice exhibits to the ring”.

Each handler is to enter the ring in order of their number from lowest to highest.

The judge will say, “Are you ready?”

All dogs must be in a sitting position before the handlers answer, “yes”

The judge will say, “For a one-minute sit stay, leave your dog”

Class 2 handlers are to move to the end of the lead in front of their dog

The judge will say, “Return to your dog”



Down stay

Class 1 handlers will stay in their positions

The judge will say, “Class 2, down your dogs”

Class 2 handlers will command their dogs to drop.

The judge will say, “for a one-minute down stay, leave your dog”

Class 2 handlers are to move to the end of the lead in front of their dog

The judge will say, “Return to your dog”

At the conclusion of the Class 2 down-stay the judge will say, “exercise finished, you may leave the ring”

Handlers are to leave the ring in single file.



WHAT IS BEING JUDGED FOR CLASS 2

All exercises are performed on lead

Heeling – lead is loose and held in both hands. Left arm is firm by the handler's side, Right arm is either at the handler's side or across their mid-section.

Sit – Stand – Drop – handler gives a verbal command, with a hand signal. Focus on, “command once, then correct”.

Right Turn – Turn must be sharp and not rounded, handler to give a verbal command, “heel” or “come right”, dog to turn in a reasonably sharp arc. Corrections allowed: small check, verbal command repeated once.

Left Turn – Turn must be sharp and not rounded, handler to give a verbal command, “heel” or “to the left”, dog to almost pivot. Corrections allowed: small check, verbal command repeated once.

Right About Turn – Handler must pivot 180° to their right and give a verbal command, “heel” or “come around”, dog to turn without exaggerated arc. Corrections allowed: small check, verbal command repeated once.

Left About Turn – Handler must pivot 180° to their left and give a verbal command, “heel” or “come around”, dog to turn without exaggerated arc. Corrections allowed: small check, verbal command repeated once.

Recall – on lead from heeling. During a heeling exercise, the examiner instructs the handler to “call your dog”. Handler stops forward motion and takes 5 or 6 rapid steps backwards calling their dog, “{name}... come!”. The exercise is complete when the dog is either sitting or standing in front of their handler.

Stand Stay – Handler must wait for instructions, then stand in front of their dog. Examiner will walk around the dog and handler. The dog should not sit or step off their position.

Sit Stay – 1 minute. Handler must wait for instructions, then stand in front of their dog. Handler **must not** be more than the length of the lead away from their dog. Upon direction, the handler steps back to their dog's side.

Down Stay – 1 minute. Handler must wait for instructions, then stand in front of their dog. Handler **must not** be more than the length of the lead away from their dog. Upon direction, the handler steps back to their dog's side.

Bridge and Reward – handler is permitted to bridge and reward their dog **ONLY** when the examiner says, “exercise finished”.

NOTE: The use of treats and clickers are permitted, however, point penalties apply for each use, except when told the exercise is finished.



Example scoring for a dog that drops on command
